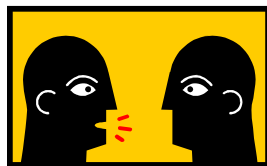
Fortunately, there are free legal

What is Sexual Assault? Any sexual contact or sexual attention committed by force, bribes, threats, manipulation, pressure, trick, or violence. Sexual Assault may be committed by anyone, including a spouse, significant other, or family member. It may be physical, or non-physical and includes rape, attempted rape, incest and child molestation and sexual harassment. Sexual assault can be verbal, visual or anything that forces a person to join in unwanted sexual contact or attention.

As a result of a sexual assault ...



- I AM CONCERNED ABOUT MY HEALTH OR MEDICAL ISSUES.



- I AM WORRIED ABOUT MY PRIVACY AND OTHER PEOPLE FINDING OUT ABOUT THE ASSAULT.



- I DO NOT FEEL SAFE WHERE I LIVE AND/OR I AM WORRIED ABOUT MY PHYSICAL SAFETY.



- I HAVE FINANCIAL AND/OR INSURANCE PROBLEMS.

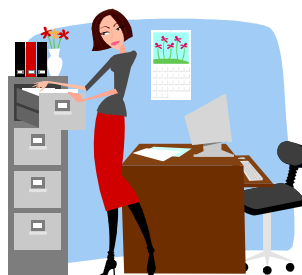
One of our attorneys can explain your legal options. If English is not your first language, we will provide a free, confidential interpreter.
