Cases We Handle

Family Law: Divorce, orders of protection, custody, child and spousal support, name changes

Housing: Foreclosures, evictions, subsidized housing, discrimination against victims of violence

Consumer: Identity theft, debt collection, repossession, wage garnishment, bankruptcy

Public Benefits: Denials and terminations

Immigration: Citizenship, VAWA self petitions, T- and U-visas, employment authorization, green card renewals

Employment: discrimination against victims of violence, reasonable accommodations

School Issues: advocacy and representation for survivors of campus sexual assault

Victims' Rights: victim advocacy in criminal court, crime victims' compensation applications, victim impact statements

Health Law: Access to health insurance and care

Privacy: Protection of privacy rights

Post-conviction relief: Sealing, expungement, certificates of relief and good conduct

Estate planning: wills, health care proxies, powers of attorney

Our Services

Our services are free and confidential.

If you qualify for services, a lawyer from our program can give you advice about your legal problem. A lawyer in one of our offices may be able to represent you in court. Sometimes, we can refer your case to a pro bono, volunteer lawyer in the community.

Our staff and pro bono attorneys are trained in trauma-informed, victim-centered advocacy.

Application Process

- HelpLine intake screeners are available by phone Monday through Friday from 9:00 AM to 3:00 PM.
- Walk-in hours vary by office. Please go to our website (laszny.org) to confirm an office is open.
- You can also apply online 24/7 at laszny.org/intake. An intake screener will contact you during HelpLine hours.
- **Please note:** HelpLine hours may change for holidays, staff training, and/or other reasons. Apply online when our HelpLine is closed.
- Please do not wait until your hearing date or deadline has passed to contact us. You may lose important legal rights.
- If you do not hear back from someone within five (5) business days, please stop in to one of our offices right away.
