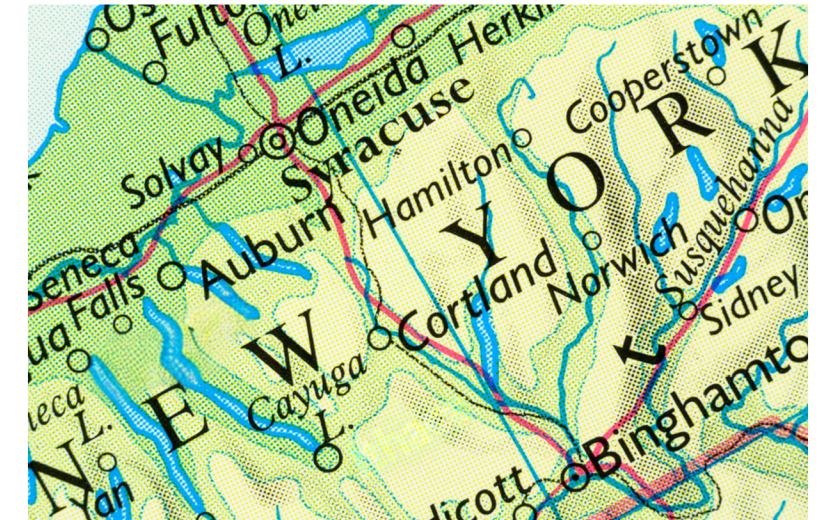

## Cases We Handle

**Housing:** Foreclosures, evictions, utility shut-offs, poor housing conditions, and Section 8 or subsidized housing problems

**Family Law:** Domestic violence, child and spousal support, names changes, divorce

**Consumer:** Debt collection, repossessions, wage garnishments, and bankruptcy

**Disability:** Denials and terminations of Supplemental Security Income (SSI) and Social Security Disability (SSD) benefits

**Elder Law:** Basic estate planning, wills, health care proxies, powers of attorney

**Immigration:** Citizenship/Naturalization, VAWA self petitions, employment authorization, green card renewals, T- and U-visas

## Application Process

- Interpretation services are available, and you can get help by walking into our offices. Walk-in hours vary by office. Please go to our website ([lasmny.org](http://lasmny.org)) to confirm an office is open.
- If you call our Legal HelpLine, an intake screener will talk to you over the phone and determine if you qualify for services.
- If you apply online, an intake screener will follow up by phone, text, or email to finish your application.
- To get services, you must provide your financial information, name, address, telephone number, and information about the legal problem.
- All information provided is kept confidential.
- If you qualify for services, a lawyer from LASMNY can give you advice about your legal problem. In some cases, we can refer your case to a pro bono, volunteer lawyer. Sometimes, a lawyer in one of our offices will be able to represent you in court.

**Important:** You do not become a client of the Legal Aid Society of Mid-New York (LASMNY) until a lawyer talks with you and agrees to take your case.

## Hours

- HelpLine intake screeners are available Monday through Friday from 9:00 AM to 3:00 PM.
- You can apply online 24/7 at [www.lasmny.org/intake](http://www.lasmny.org/intake). An intake screener will contact you during HelpLine hours.
- **Please note:** HelpLine hours may change for holidays, staff training, and/or other reasons. Apply online when our Legal HelpLine is closed.
- Please do not wait until your hearing date or deadline has passed to contact us. You may lose important legal rights.
- If you do not hear back from someone within five (5) business days, please stop in to one of our offices right away.
